

Siksha Chetana Programme



Education is the most important element for the growth & prosperity of a nation. Education in its real sense is the pursuit of truth. It is an endless journey through knowledge and enlightenment. Unless the people are literate no nation can claim to be knowledgeable. But many of the times children in the rural areas do not go to the school due to a host of reasons like distance of the school, teacher - centric school curricula, rampant poverty, lack of awareness etc. In order to make the education system more child-friendly WOSCA launched the Siksha Chetana Programme with the active support of ORES-Rourkela. Under this programme vocational training on Tailoring for the unemployed girls & women has been started in two GPs & thirteen VLEPs have been prepared. WOSCA has also taken steps to bring together an increasing number of community based organizations & civil society partners in to a collaborative relationship for the betterment of the school education. This process of advocacy has generated an unprecedented awareness about education & witnessed a very intense school community interface that might be the foundation for a sustained progression towards our objective of providing quality education for all the children.

MEDP on NTFP Processing

With a view to enable the SHG members to manage and sustain micro enterprises on NTFP for livelihood enhancement a MEDP training was imparted to 30 SHG members on NTFP Value addition and setting up micro enterprises (Mahua, Tamarind & Tola) in Sarupat village of Rutisila G.P. of Ghatagaon Block of Keonjhar district with the support of NABARD. The training program was of 13 days duration i.e from 10th July - 22nd July 2008. Mr Omkar Ram as the Resource Person facilitated the training program & trainees trained on processing and value addition of NTFPs i.e., Harida, Bahada, Amla, Bela, Tamarind, berry, Mahula, Tola and Honey. 30 trainees from 4 women SHGs have been selected on the basis of involvement in NTFP trading & credibility of future replication. Apart from class room teaching and practical training Resource Inventory was conducted by the resource person to familiarize the SHG members with sustainable NTFP harvesting and potential economic assessment. Trainees have been trained on NTFP processing and scope of multi product mix as value addition.



Environment Building for Adolescent Girls



Adolescence is the period of rapid physical growth, sexual and psychological changes. Habits and behaviour picked up during adolescence have lifelong impact. It is the last chance to correct the growth lag and malnutrition. To increase access information health, on education, environment, etc. for the adolescent girls WOSCA is implementing a project on environment building for the adolescent girls of Naranpur G.P. of Sadar Block of Keonjhar District collaboration with Ministry of Youth affairs & Sports, Govt. of India, New Delhi. Under this programme around 104 adolescent girls from different villages have been educated & shared their experience regarding problems adolescence & maternity health that takes place in this period. In this year Workshop for MTA & PTA, Palla shows & Peer groups meetings have been conducted to provide necessary education to the PRI members, parents, teachers and social activists & young girls to enable them to develop their knowledge base & legal awareness & aid to prevent the illegal trafficking of women & girls.

Mainstreaming Livelihoods and Linking Grassroots Governance

Climate change has come to be seen as a major global environmental challenge. With an objective to catalyse public participation in the global campaign to protect health from the adverse effect of climate change & to enable them to access the Government & Non-Government schemes like NREGS. Food & Social security schemes, Health mission, Herbal mission, Bamboo mission and Gender & Governance, Water & Sanitation, etc. a project on capitalising opportunity mainstreaming resources to impact livelihoods and linking grassroots governance for adaptation to climate change in ecofragile areas of Orissa is being implemented by WOSCA as a Network Based Approach in Basantpur & Rutisila G.P. of Ghatagaon block. Under this programme focus was given on environmental awareness, Rapport building, Local strengthening of governance, Formation of Forest Rights Committees, Strengthening of existing VSS, Strengthening of Village Development Committees, GP level Planning, Facilitation of NREGS and other awareness activities. People have been sensitized on the fact that climate change is a threat not just to our environment but also to the growth & development of the society. This programme is supported by UDYAMA-Nayagarh.

HIV / AIDS Awareness Programme

To enhance knowledge on basic concept and response building on HIV/AIDS among the rural people and it's mainstreaming in development programmes a GP level awareness programme was organized at Maidankel with the active support of CPF-Secunderabad. A total of 106 participants from five villages participated in this programme. The representative of CPF, Mr. Rajanikant & others educated the participants is to respond effectively to the HIV /AIDS pandemic in Orissa; reducing risk and vulnerability to HIV infection and ensuring that those people living with HIV / AIDS or affected by it have an improved quality of life. Discussion took place on program participants, strategies, stigma and discrimination, prevent and control, support PLHIV, advocacy and capacity building of HIV/AIDS.

Blood Donation Camp



Blood Donation is one of the noble and dedicated works of social activist. It becomes the part of and parcel of **WOSCA** activists to motivate donors to donate blood since a drop of blood can save life of a dying patient. In the year 2008 WOSCA has organized two Blood Donation Camps at Sadar Block of the district to combat the deficit of blood in the District Blood Bank, Keonjhar. With the help of District Blood Bank In charge Dr. Sibasish Maharana and his team 51 units of blood Dharanidhara collected from Autonomous College, Keonjhar and 32 units of Blood collected from the students of Santoshi Maa Regional College Jharbelda Keonjhar & handed over to Red Cross Society, Keonjhar.

Health Camp

Rural areas of Keonjhar district is devoid of much health infrastructure. Many of the PHCs and CHCs in these areas do not function properly. In this year WOSCA organized three health camps in of Banspal Block, Gavalmund Harichandanpur Block and Harmath of Joda Block of Keonjhar District. More than 2000 people including 364 women and 532 children availed of the free medical check up service. The poor and the needy were given medicines free of cost. These programmes were supported Department of Health & Ms. Ramsaran Das Agrawal Charitable Trust, Keonjhar.

Creche Programme

Children are the future Torch-bearers of the country and they have to be cared & nurtured properly. But despite the fact they are invisible to our system & efforts to get children into school are extremely complicated in the rural areas. Considering this WOSCA has taken up the Creche Programme since the year 2000 at Nischintpur village of Sadar block. The Crech centre is providing day time nursing support to the working women's children of the area with the support of Central Social Welfare Board. A total of 25 children are being taken care of here. This programme has also brought greater convergence between various programmes like Integrated Nutrition & Health Project supported by CARE-India as crucial inputs to the larger mission of WOSCA. The programme has created an environment where pre-schooling process are being more closely looked at. This year fourteen children passed out the schedule age of 5 years have been sent to the nearest primary school for

TB Control Programme

To monitor the recovery status of Tuberculosis patients treated earlier, the followup programmes were undertaken routinely by WOSCA through various means such as home visit and correspondence. A total of 27 nos. of patients of different categories were found to have fully recovered from the disease and were leading a clean life. This programme is being supported by Dist. Hospital & implemented at Ghatagaon & Joda block of Keonjhar. With the help of District TB Control Society (DTCS), WOSCA has started provision of Directly Observed Therapy (Scheme-2) programme from April 2008 to ensure defaulter retrieval of TB patients in case the patient doesn't receive DOT as scheduled. WOSCA has taken up awareness programme on DOT in the entire GPs of Ghtagaon block of Keonjhar district.

Small Business Activities through RGVN

Though women in rural areas are exposed to some of the enterprises but it is not sufficient for them to establish in that venture. To guide & help in choosing which enterprise they should take up WOSCA has extended credit assistance to 23 women members of 16 SHGs of Sadar & Ghatagaon block with the support of RGVN, Bhubaneswar since last year. Of all these women beneficiaries 6 beneficiaries have already repaid the loan to the organization.

Public Hearing on PDS



To streamline the Public Distribution System at the grass root level a Public hearing programme on PDS was organised at Badapichhula village of Ghatagaon block of Keonjhar on 29th December 2008. The programme was organised by WOSCA in association with CYSD. The Public Hearing came as a part of the country wide response to the interim order of the Supreme Court on 28 Nov. 2001 on the PUCL Petition. The Court had ordered all the State Governments enforce the food and nutrition oriented schemes properly. The Public Hearing on PDS was addressed by Sushama Devi, APD, DRDA, Keonjhar, Prafulla Rout of CYSD. & Dharitri Rout, Secretary of WOSCA & others came to respond to the complaints raised by the public.

Evaluation, Impact Study & Follow up

To assess the impact of technological intervention, information empowerment, organizational & financial management & leadership development, effort has been taken by WOSCA through monitoring & evaluation of the project activities. Such evaluation has helped to pinpoint to the thrust areas that need to be restressed. Similarly impact study has been done by the students of Xavier Institute of Management through RLLE. Project-wise follow up activities to have knowledge on the progress and sustainability of the project has been conducted periodically.

Land & Water Management

In order to address sustainable livelihood as a strategy to improve the living standards of the poverty stricken tribal households by involving management of soil & water along with various agronomical interventions, **WOSCA** implementing NRM programme in 50 villages of Ghatagaon block of the district under the sponsorship of CONCERN Worldwide-India. In addition to the activities for creation of water bodies and land development a number of livelihood support activities have been taken up. Under agriculture & horticulture development, plantation work has been taken up. Out of the planned villages, rehabilitation of degraded forest activities has been taken up in 10 villages. The major objective behind these activities is to meet the livelihood needs of the households, who are untouched by the implementation of land & water management.



Orissa Forestry Programme-III



To sensitize the vulnerable sections of the society on Forest conservation issues WOSCA has been implementing Orissa Forestry Programme-II in Maidankel GP of Sadar block with the support of Centre for People's Forestry (CPF-Secunderabad). Under this programme five VSS have been strengthened & Nine SHGs in five villages covering 127 members have opened SB A/cs. in the Bank of Baroda in this year. Two Micro-Planning has been conducted in Basudevpur & Talapada villages to make a comparative analysis between the future and the present situation of the village and to make an environmental analysis. Village planning has been completed in five villages before the special Palli Sabha Formal conducted. discussion with community has been completed & planning for Agro Forestry has been started with the active support of Horticulture Deptt in two villages for creation of fodder & fuel wood. 90 women have been sensitized on women rights, gender issues through Gender sensitisation workshop held at Chhemundibill village. This year an awareness meeting was organized at Talapada village on the occasion of International Women's week. 111 Women have been sensitized to take part in decision making process through SHG meetings, village meetings, VSS meetings & community level meetings. Additionally Awareness programmes on forest issues & HIV / AIDS have been organised in five villages of Maidankel G.P.

Panchayati Raj Initiatives –PRI-III



The PRI represents a key opportunity strengthening Government activities empowering people to demand better services. Poor people can now take responsibility for ensuring that services are delivered efficiently and effectively. In order to create a system of democracy where people were at the centre of decision making, actively involved participating, WOSCA is implementing Panchayati Raj Initiative (PRI-III) project since 2004. This year WOSCA has conducted 8 nos. of Capacity building Programmes for the CBO & PR members of four Model GPs. Again 482 people of 4 model GPs have been sensitized on FRA through 11 community level awareness meetings organized in Ghatagaon & Patna block. 30 PR members have been taken exposure to Sirigida GP on the role of Forum in grass root planning process & their implementation. Besides these programmes five awareness campaign through Cultural show, i.e. Palla has been organized in two Model GPs to sensitise the community on the objectives & features of NREGA & RTI-2005. Two block level meetings have been organized for Strengthening the PR Leaders Forum of Ghatagaon & Patna block. To put pressure on the administration & to provide suitable solutions to the emerging issues of the GPs of Patna & Ghatagaon block at the administrative level, a Media-PRIs inter-face programme was organized on the august presence of the Media persons & volunteers in the district headquarter.

Social Audit on NREGA



On behalf of NIRD-Hyderabad three nos. of Social Audit programme on NREGA was held at Sarasposi, Raikala & Basantapur GPs of Sadar, Patna & Ghatagaon blocks of Keonjhar district. These programmes were attended by Mr. B.B. Mohapatra, District Collector, Sushama Devi, APD-DRDA & a number of independent observers. WOSCA extended active collaboration to NIRD, Hyderabad in the matter of organizing the event. The objective of the programme was to create awareness among the people on their job entitlements & wage rights.

SRI Cultivation Programme



This year WOSCA developed its interest to empower the farmers and to carry out the farmers' movement towards sustainable agriculture and sustainable food security of the rural and tribal population. In pursuance of this goal, the organization extended necessary training support to Thirteen Self Help groups of Ghatagaon & Sadar block aiming at farmers' participation in the govt. policy for agriculture and rural development. More over, training on Mushroom cultivation & Vegetable cultivation were imparted to 34 members of three SHGs.

Youth Development Programme

Youth hood is a very special time with special challenges. Many youth in India are virtually deprived of their rights to youth hood owing to lack of opportunities and basic necessities of life. They can play a vital role in nation building. Keeping it in view WOSCA organized a youth leadership training programme to infuse the sense of nation building and leadership among them in which 70 youth from the Pandapada GP participated. In this programme special emphasis was laid on their role in village development programme, village planning, identification of key issues, monitoring of development programme, Self Employment programmes, character building, patriotism, self-reliance which improve the functional ability of the rural youth. Apart from these, WOSCA being an organization of the youth run a Youth development Centre at Pandapada since last five years. As an effort to empower & enable the rural youth to realize their full identity and power in all spheres of life, WOSCA is trying to promote rural sports and the spirit of competitiveness amongst them. During this year WOSCA organized several sports like football, volleyball, Criket, in its project areas.

Jute Floor Furnishing Craft under AHVY Programme

The AHVY Jute Cluster project is being implemented at Mareigaon Village of Hatadihi block of Keonjhar district because our Baseline study findings emphasized upon the improvement of vulnerable rural artisans of the district. In Mareigaon cluster, jute mat is one of the important sources of employment for artisans. In spite of their skill & knowledge on certain craft, the artisans were not getting ample opportunities to expand their business & earn a smooth living at the end of the day. The organization also studied on more income opportunities, the resource availability, credibility, market strength and artisans' potency and started cluster development programme on Jute Craft since last two years. Again

the organization targeted the untrained but potential rural artisans of this area segregated them into different SHGs and provided them scientific methods of producing demandable decorative items. In this year WOSCA has successfully conducted six Skill up gradation training programmes and Four Design and Technical Development Workshop in Mareigaon cluster of Hatadihi block of Keonjhar district. In order to make the training programme sufficiently purposive and effective WOSCA invited four Master Designers from outside the state & two nos of highly skilled Master crafts persons on Jute crafts from the local jute cluster. Under their



guidance Design workshop for four batches & skill training for six batches were completed and varieties of floor mats developed in the training programme.

Cluster Development Programme on Terracotta Craft

Under NPRI terracotta cluster development project supported by NABARD & implemented by WOSCA a market survey inside the state from 13th – 18th February-2009 and an Exposure visit to West Bengal from 24th-28th February 2009 have been conducted in order to build up the capacity of terracotta artisans on modern techniques and ascertain the markets for their products. Two artisans from the cluster trained on different techniques of market survey, institution contact and buyers interaction. They are made aware on product assessment and preparation of buyers profile including specific choice prior to market survey. Similarly market survey team met with shop owners,



artisans and promoting agencies from different districts who are participating / facilitating in expos and Craft Bazar and were also asked about the role that the Internet and other media, such as magazines and television, played in their business, either for research, decorating ideas and ordering



products. This has provided insight to artisans knowing the market and promotion of products more effectively. Market study team visited the Workshop at Pragati Maidan, Craft Museum at Delhi Hat and Anandgram Gurugaon, MRITIKA of Bolpur, Kala Bhawan of Santiniketan, Silpa Sadana of Viswavarati, Krutika Terracotta Unit of Bhubaneswar, Kalayatana of Sundergarh & other places.

Tracking Entitlements of Rural Community for Livelihood Security

The poor have suffered as they have little knowledge of their rights and entitlements and lack the collective strength to raise their voices. With an objective to inform and empower the marginalized rural communities to claim their entitlements for

livelihood security a project on is being implemented by WOSCA partnering with two other NGOs i.e. CYSD and PRAKALPA in above two blocks with the active support of CONCERN Worldwide. This project is focusing on informing them about their rights and entitlements and empowering them through regular interface with the govt to push for corrective measures. Since August 2008 PDS, Pension and NREGP entitlements of



poor are being tracked in real time basis in two Blocks of Keonjhar district of Orissa using mobile phones.

Under this project a primary census of entitlements of 43009 households under NREGS, PDS and pension schemes completed in Banspal and Ghatagaon blocks. 28000 HHs made aware on provisions of PDS and NREGP through 299 community sensitization meeting and ensuring their PDS entitlements by demanding their rights from panchayats. 1398 Job cards in 13 GPs have been returned to beneficiaries followed to community demand. 334 differently abled persons applied for pension after the census and 29 have started availing monthly pension. 432 HHs got their full quota of Kerosene for September in Pipila and Purumunda Gram Panchayats. Village volunteers helped 334 differently abled persons to apply for pension. 127 Bogus cards in 9 GPs identified and seized by Panchayats. In two blocks 123 availed PDS cards -They were in entitlement list since 1997 but unaware of it. 1n 6 pilot GPs people asked Panchayat to furnish the data of PDS left over specifically on Rice and Kerosene. In 4 villages of Singipur and Nayakote GP of Banspal block people have agitated before panchayat as they were not informed properly on time and date of PDS distribution through Mobile van. Timely intimation on distribution dates are given by panchayats in all 21 GPs of Banspal in case of mobile distribution. Resistance of vested interest people are gradually declining as the people started counter attack on the irregularities in distribution. Project awarded at National Level as best paper in the compendium in 12th National Conference on E-Governance - Goa.

Empowering the Poor to claim their Entitlement for Livelihood Security

With the support of Concern Worldwide India a livelihood development project is being implemented in Ghatagoan block since April 2004 in order to help people out from their livelihood stress and earn livelihood from existing Right to Food schemes of Government. With



the consolidated experience WOSCA up scaled livelihood the development activities from 10 villages (Working earlier) to 56 villages of 12 Gram Panchayat of three blocks covering 10279 HHs. project put a strong emphasis addressing the food insecurities of target households through empowering them to demand their entitlements i.e. wage, right to food, social security and forest land rights with the objective to prepare and empower the poor to claim entitlement to achieve secured livelihood in Ghatagaon, Patna and Harichandanpur Block of keonjhar district.

During this year People from 7880 HHs made aware of provisions of NREGA. 56 village volunteers trained and helping people in accessing NREGA along with gram sathi. They have been instrumental in opening of Post office pass book for 1882 HHs. 65,223 person days have been generated which resulted creation of village infrastructure of Rs 63,95,947.00. For land development Rs 17,24,348.00 leveraged from Soil conservation. In 7 GPs people have taken up NREGA implementation issues at district forum and got solutions i.e issues of order to open

Bio-Diversity Conservation Programme

In order to create incentive mechanisms to encourage people to involve more actively in protecting the environment *WOSCA* has kept momentum to sensitise the community through its capacity building program on **Bio-diversity Conservation** with the support of Centre for Environment Education (CEE) under UNDP-SGP-GEF projects. This program covered 50 villages of Sadar & Ghatagaon block. This project is a community capacity building program to enhance and conserve the traditional methods of

Environment conservation method shared with 2536 villagers (1814 female and 722 male) through direct sensitization process and made aware on scope of livelihood enhancement through biodiversity conservation. Village wise livelihood pattern has been analyzed in all the villages. 50 trainings on forest protection & conservation held. 21 Forest Protection groups formed and 14 existing groups Strengthened. A cluster committee was formed including VSS members of five villages to achieve combined effort on forest protection. 505 nos. of SHG members from 50 villages trained on mapping of forest resources and 274 women members from 24 SHGs trained on NTFP processing and value addition i.e Mahua, Tola & Tamarind. 534 families have been trained & adopted kitchen gardening and producing vegetables there by supplementing their household level nutrition. As the output of the project;



- Community dependency on forest derived.
- Educational status and village resource persons identified to carry on conservation messages.
- Village infrastructure used and resource conservation pattern analyzed and documented.
- Inter cultural practices documented and incorporated in conservation plan.
- Village wise land use pattern documented to be placed in Palli Sabha.
- Knowledge on vermin compost shared with 1270 villagers and 910 farmers started integrated home garden concept.

Besides, 236 farmers preparing liquid manure and compost with household waste in regular basis. 11 tenant farmers group formed and accounts have been opened in concerned Bank. In 32 villages SHG members have taken responsibilities to document their biodiversity and it is shared to the community and children of the villages. In 41 out of total 50 villages demarcation completed where forest department personnel were present along with villagers from adjacent villages.

Integrated Nutrition & Health Project-

With the support of CARE-Orissa Integrated Nutrition and Health Project-II is being implemented by WOSCA at 50 demonstration sites of 5 blocks, i.e., Sadar, Jhumpura, Ghatagaon & Joda (Urban & Tribal) of Keonjhar district. In the middle part of 2008, Ghatagaon, Sadar & Jhumpura were phased out. This project emphasised in bringing about sustainable improvement of nutrition and health status of Women and Children (0-6 years) and to sensitize service providers to deliver proper service at community level. As a part of the program, WOSCA has facilitated best practices of maternal and child health care with new innovations & ensured quality immunization services at session site & ensured the tally of records between AWW/ANM. WOSCA has also ensured the adoption of borderline children by SHG members to increase the normal grade children status. Under this project,

- 65% of AWW using their home visit planner during the critical content of targeted beneficiaries. 100% of target beneficiaries are being covered in the SNP program of ICDS.
- Increase the consciousness about the consumption of 100 IFA and 3 ANC and additional meal and appropriate rest during the pregnancy period.



- Generated the non informing role of quality services of CBO/PRI on NHD & routine immunization in the community.
- 90% use of five cleans like-clean home, clean hand, clean thread, clean code and new blade.
- An increase of 30% to 75% of due list prepared by the AWW/ANM before the immunization session.
- 90% of service providers well capacitated on health and nutrition intervention of INHP.
- 75% of children compiled the fully immunization schedule within one year.
- Health issues are being discussed in the SHG meetings.

Besides these WOSCA facilitates services that are being provided at Anganwadi Centres i.e., regular health check-ups, complete and timely immunization, antenatal and postnatal care, newborn care, nutrition education and counselling to beneficiaries to access health services with the help of ICDS functionaries and Dept. of Health. The project was aimed at replication of best practices in 40% of RS. From July 2005 DS focus approach changed to Sector Focus approach, where all AWCs of ICDS project are taken up for intervention for improving maternal and child health practices at community level by facilitating sector level monitoring & supervision, information analysis and use through effective coordination between government counterparts. In changed focus WOSCA facilitates the process of system strengthening, system engagement and capacity building of service providers of both ICDS and Health Dept. to ensure better service coverage at community level. Around 3,000 pregnant and nourishing mothers and 50,000 children are being covered in 5 blocks under this program. WOSCA also facilitates in identifying out reach pockets and service gaps at different level and support to bridge the gaps through lobby and advocacy at block and district level.
